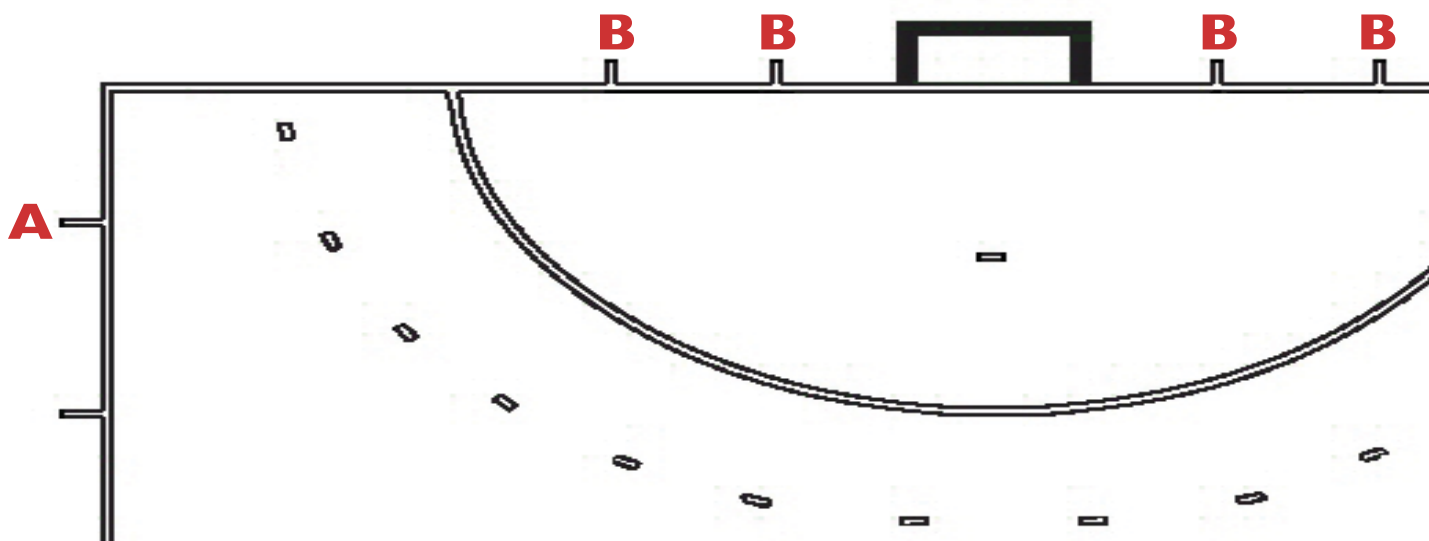

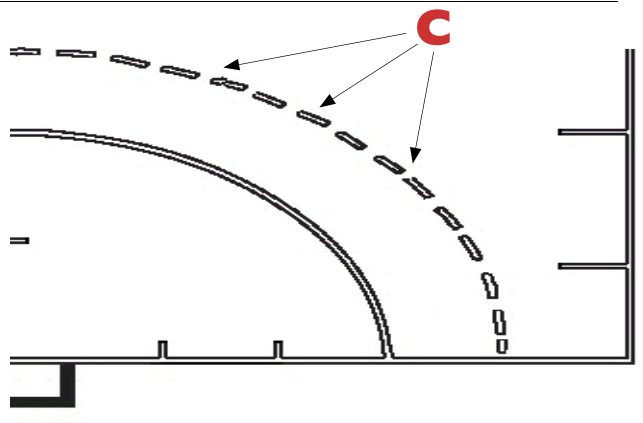
HOCKEY COMPETITION SURFACES

There is one major change to how the modern competition surface in hockey is marked—management points for the corner (**A**) and penalty corner (**B**) are marked with descenders *AWAY* from the competition surface. If you are about to remark your hockey competition surface for the fall season, please consider making these improvements.



CORRECTING TWO COMMON ERRORS

1. A growing number of competition surfaces are being marked with too many indicators (**C**) of the area outside the circle in which special management rules apply. Please limit the number of these markers to a total of 14 markings, each 2" wide and about 12" long.

2. Many colleges in the United States have marked their penalty corner management points (**B**) using 5 *yard* increments. Please note that the correct increment for colleges is 5 *meters*.
