



1. Would a team be allowed to film the match and either stream video to the bench area for coaching and / or bring the film into the locker room at halftime to view?
2. Can a team take "still" images during the game for printout and use at the bench during the match or halftime?
3. Is radio communication allowed between the bench area and a remote location?

Would there be a restriction to where the remote location can be?

4. Can someone from a remote location communicate with players on the sideline?

RESPONSE:

At this time, the NCAA Modifications Committee is unaware of any NCAA legislation that would preclude the items mentioned above, as long as the individuals' videoing or communicating with the coaches and student-athletes are other coaches. For example, if Assistant Coach A is in the "remote location" communicating with Student Athletes on the sideline, there is no problem. If, however, the institution has hired another individual or uses an existing non-coaching staff member in that role, that would be a violation of the DI coaching limitations legislation (Bylaw 11.7).
